The PackageHub Business Center® franchise is offered to independently owned retail shipping and business centers. As a franchisee, you will participate in programs that offer collective purchasing, methods for enhancing and streamlining the experience for your customers, and advertising and marketing programs to help promote your business.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a new PackageHub Business Center franchise ranges from \$6,085 to \$12,910. This includes ~~\$50,230~~ to ~~\$600,780~~ that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate if you are a new franchisee or ~~\$550,730~~ to ~~\$1,400,280~~ that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate if you are a former franchisee and your franchise agreement terminated or expired without timely renewal and you are applying for reinstatement.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.**
